

Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goal

By the end of the 2019-2020 school year, the percentage of students performing on grade level in all subject areas will increase by 5 percentage points as measured by district mandated assessments.

Pine Hill Middle School Goals

Math

- To improve student achievement in Mathematics for all students including students with disabilities and economically disadvantaged students
- Increase mathematics achievement for all students from 11% to 22%.

Focus Area: Increase student performance at or above grade level.

Reading

- Improve student achievement in Reading and Language Arts for all students including students with disabilities and economically disadvantaged students.
- Increase Reading/ELA achievement for all students from 22% to 32%.

Focus Area: Increase Literacy and Writing skills for all students.

Focus Areas: Increase the level of student engagement in all classrooms with support through appropriate interventions

In the School

Pine Hill Middle School will work with students and their families to support students' success in mastering the standards in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Offer Parent University highlighting various academic and district-wide initiatives. Topics may include i-Ready, Georgia Milestones, Infinite Campus training, and content area focus.
- Provide open communication with parents utilizing various methods such as Newsletters, Infinite Campus, agenda notebook, Progress Report, and verbal communication.
- Share links to family-friendly web sites from our school and class web pages to aid in building vocabulary and math skills.
- Provide parents with materials from the learning kit full of fun materials dealing with literacy and math located in the Parent resource room.

At Home

Pine Hill Middle School parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math.

- Try to attend Parent University highlighting various academic and district-wide initiatives. Topics may include iReady, Georgia Milestones, infinite campus training, and content area focus.
- Look for the class newsletter each month and check out the school's web site. Take advantage of the Infinite Campus Parent Portal, and check the agenda daily.
- Play board games and computer games with the new vocabulary words and find ways to use these words in family conversations.
- Have fun with math and involve students. Have students calculate the tip at a restaurant or the actual price of something on sale.
- Use materials in the Parent Resource room to explore math and Literacy at home.

Students

Pine Hill Middle School students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for the stars in math and reading. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- Try to make up my own learning game and share it with parents and teacher during Parent University.
- Bring class newsletter and agenda home about Family Fun academic activities.
- Create games using models, such as: Legos and straws to model math problems; and note cards to write down newly learned vocabulary words.
- Take home materials from the learning kit for parent to view and assist student with.

What is a School-Parent Compact?

Jointly Developed

The parents, students, and staff worked together and shared ideas to develop the school-parent compact. Students completed comment cards to add ideas for the compact. Meetings are held each year to review and revise the compact based on the school's academic achievement goals and students' needs. 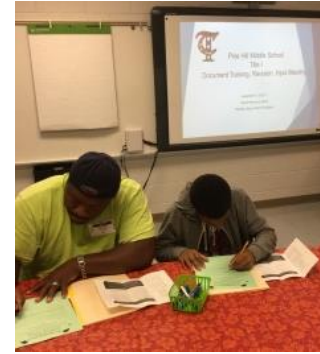
Communication about Student Learning
