5th Grade Supply List 2024-2025 School Year



ELA/Reading/Science/Health/Math/Social Studies

- 6 Composition (marble side bound) Notebooks*
- 3 **Plastic** Two-Pocket Folders (do not need to have prongs)
- 4 **Plastic** Two-Pocket Folders with prongs
- Wide-Ruled Notebook Paper (2-3 packs)

We don't have a preference of color for the composition notebooks and folders; they can be any color or design you choose. We will label them for each subject in class.

5th Grade Homeroom School Supplies

- 2 Ear buds **or** headphones (these will be used **every day.**) The school <u>does not</u> supply headphones for students.
- 1 Binder w/clear view front/back for printed inserts (1 or 1 1/2 inch)
- 1 pack of Tab dividers (5 tab with pockets)
- 1 Pack of 3x5 Index Cards
- #2 pencils (a box of 24 count or higher)
- cap erasers
- highlighter
- scissors
- glue sticks at least 8-10 glue sticks altogether
- small box of crayons (24 count)
- Pencil Zipper Pouch (needs to be an appropriate size to hold their pencils, scissors, glue sticks, and small box of crayons)
- Book bag that can fit their binder, pencil pouch, library books, & occassionally a textbook (**NO ROLLING BOOKBAGS**)
- Ziploc Bags (Gallon, quart, and/or sandwich)
- Kleenex (Box)
- Hand Sanitizer
- When students bring in their school supplies, they will be labeled with your child's name and stored for them to access and use throughout the year.
- The only shared items are the Ziploc bags, Kleenex, and hand sanitizer.
- In 5th grade, we use interactive notebooks, which involves a lot of cutting, gluing, & coloring foldables into their composition notebooks for taking notes & organizing content. Therefore, we have asked for your support and commitment in getting all of the main supplies listed; and we will support your investment and commit to using them with your child in class.
- We ask for 2 sets of ear buds or headphones because in the past, when students carry them from class to class and then home; they tend to get broken, lost, or forgotten and then that becomes an issue in the classroom. They will go back home with the students at the end of the school year.
