## School and Community

August 2002, Freedom Park Elementary School opened its doors to over 500 PreK-5th grade students. Beginning in 2007, sixth through eighth grades was added to the school, over the course of a three year period. With the addition of middle grades, the school's name was changed to Freedom Park School. The school is located on the military installation and serves families residing on Fort Gordon.

## **General Information**

Freedom Park School offers a rigorous curriculum to all students from Pre-kindergarten through eighth grade. Currently, we are seeking to become a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) certified school. As we prepare for STEM certification, we offer an integrated curriculum that is driven by problem solving, discovery, exploratory project/problem-based learning, and student centered development of ideas and solutions. Additionally, students in our middle grades will have the opportunity to earn up to three high school credits by the time they complete the eighth grade. Students may earn high school credit in Algebra, Physical Science, and Spanish.

## College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI)

College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) is Georgia's statewide accountability system. The CCRPI assesses how well students are prepared for college and careers and ensures that schools are focused on improving achievement among all students. The index measures progress on indicators content mastery, student such as attendance, and preparation for the next school level. Schools earn CCRPI points based on indicators that vary by grade and school level and align with measures of college- and career-readiness. Schools may earn up to a set number of points in three main categories, for a total of 100 possible points.
