You will choose the novel you read from our library off of the Approved Novel List. As you read, you will complete the Project Blue Print and then go on to create one of the 3 choice projects. In class during the last week of every 9 weeks, you will present your project to your classmates. There is an endless amount of data to support the benefits of reading everyday. Our main goal here is to improve literacy, raise Lexile Levels, and help students their develop reading appetites.

Homework Homework in this class is always that week's vocabulary handout and reading, recording, and responding on that weeks reading log handout. Both handouts will be due on Fridays.

Parents should sign off on their child's reading log every night. Homework accounts for 30%, a very large portion of your grade.
