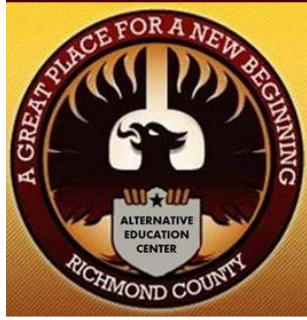

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School and Community

The Alternative Education School serves a multicultural community in Richmond County and promotes high academic standards through strategic implementation of the curriculum set forth by the Georgia Department of Education and the expectations of the Richmond County School System. AES provides a place for new beginnings for all students as they are challenged to look to the future and seize opportunities that have been directed their way!

Class Rank and Grade Point Average

An official class rank is compiled for each grade that is computed at the end of the year. Averages are carried out to three decimal places and final averages are not rounded. Grades for the class of 2016 and 2017 are unweighted. Student's grade point average (GPA) will be based on quality points beginning with the graduating class of 2018. Regular high school courses will be on a 4.0 scale and AP, IB and College/University Courses on a 5.0 scale awarded for each grade earned. High school student transcripts include the GPA, class rank and numerical average.

General Information

The faculty and staff at the Alternative Education School offers a strong curriculum with more than 100 possible course selections. Students are exposed to programs and interventions that help them develop social skills that will ensure their success. Comprehensive services are available for special education students and students with special needs.

Special Programs

AES hosts Move on When Ready (Dual Enrollment) In-house Program with Augusta Technical College and a Cohort Monitoring Program both with collaborative efforts with each student's zoned school.

College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI)

College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) is Georgia's statewide accountability system. The CCRPI assesses how well students are prepared for college and careers and ensures that schools are focused on improving achievement among all students. The index measures progress on indicators such as content mastery, student attendance, and preparation for the next school level. Schools earn CCRPI points based on indicators that vary by grade and school level and align with measures of college- and career-readiness. Schools may earn up to a set number of points in three main categories, for a total of 100 possible points.
