School and Community

Established in 1970, to accommodate the children living on post at Fort Gordon, Barton Chapel is the focal point of several communities. Our enrollment is approximately 504 students who attend Pre-Kindergarten through 5th grades. We are a Title 1 school inclusive of Special Education. A small number of students receive speech services or have 504 plans. Located in South Augusta, Barton Chapel has the demographics of an inner-city school. Our population is 92% African- American, 3%Hispanic, and 5% Caucasian. Students come from varied socioeconomic backgrounds. We are supported by various community outreach programs. Barton Chapel presently serves children in the Barton Village, McDuffie Woods, Cherry Hills, and Belfair Lakes communities.

General Information

Barton Chapel Elementary School provides students in grades Pre-Kindergarten through Fifth with a challenging, well developed rigorous education, enriched by unique experiences that occur in each classroom and with each teacher. Students are immersed in effective instruction each day using state standards and district level curriculum. There is also a significant focus on literacy based programs to ensure students are performing on grade level. Simultaneously, Barton Chapel has created a motivational program, the Distinguished Guys with Ties club to help build self-esteem and social awareness. To continue with individual personal and social development Barton Chapel collaborates with Richmond County Technical Magnet School to establish a building level Mentoring Program. Barton Chapel then reached out beyond its walls to establish a partnership with Broadway Baptist Church to provide an After School Tutorial Program for students with academic needs in reading. In addition to meeting students' needs in school, Barton Chapel along with the Golden Harvest Backpack Program provides disadvantaged students with a weekend take home food package.

College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI)

College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) is Georgia's statewide accountability system. The CCRPI assesses how well students are prepared for college and careers and ensures that schools are focused on improving achievement among all students. The index measures progress on indicators such as content mastery, student attendance, and preparation for the next school level. Schools earn CCRPI points based on indicators that vary by grade and school level and align with measures of college- and career-readiness. Schools may earn up to a set number of points in three main categories, for a total of 100 possible points.
