School and Community

Glenn Hills Middle School is a public, suburban middle school located in Southwest Richmond County. At its initial opening in 1996, under the leadership of Bertha Sutton, GHMS had an enrollment of 1,108 students making it the largest middle school in Richmond County. With the opening of Freedom Park School on the military Base of Fort Gordon, our student population has declined over the years. Our feeder schools are Glenn Hills, Barton Chapel, and Meadowbrook Elementary Schools, while we feed into Glenn Hills High School. We are the home of the mighty Seminoles wearing our school colors burgundy and gold with great pride. Our motto is "Reaching for the Hill." Our students' goal is reaching for Glenn Hills High School and beyond.

General Information

Glenn Hills Middle School provides students in grades 6 through 8 with a challenging, well developed, unified curriculum that follows the State Common CORE Standards. Our goal is to prepare students for success outside of the walls of GHMS. This school year will see GHMS introduce the Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) program that has a documented track record of improving student college and career readiness. We serve our gifted students through Honors English and the Math Team. We teach leadership and civil responsibility through the Leadership program, Ladies of Excellence, and Gentlemen of Distinction. We provide outlets for students who are talented in extracurricular subjects through the Reading Bowl, Dance team, Drama club, and Rising High music group. Lastly, we promote athletic development through our athletic program which includes cheerleaders and a dynamic marching band.

College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI)

College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) is Georgia's statewide accountability system. The CCRPI assesses how well students are prepared for college and careers and ensures that schools are focused on improving achievement among all students. The index measures progress on indicators such as content mastery, student attendance, and preparation for the next school level. Schools earn CCRPI points based on indicators that vary by grade and school level and align with measures of college- and career-readiness. Schools may earn up to a set number of points in three main categories, for a total of 100 possible points.
