School and Community

Willis Foreman Elementary School, located at 2413 Willis Foreman Road opened its doors in the fall of 1989. The school was named after Willis Foreman Road, which honored Ralph B. Willis and Oscar Foreman, two successful south Augusta dairy farmers. Willis Foreman is a Title I public school in Richmond County that serves over 300 students in grades Pre-Kindergarten through Fifth grade. Willis Foreman's feeder schools are Spirit Creek Middle and Hephzibah High School. Willis Foreman Elementary is located in Hephzibah, GA. With a population of approximately 4,500 people, Hephzibah offers small town living, while providing metropolitan access to Augusta, GA, home of The Augusta National and Fort Gordon.

General Information

Willis Foreman Elementary School offers the RCK12 Curriculum (Rigorous Curriculum and Knowledge through 12). RCK12 is a comprehensive curriculum that provides a consistent instructional framework to prepare students for success in college and the 21st century workplace. The instructional day also incorporates many special programs including a student produced yearbook, a garden club, a media club, a Helen Ruffin Reading Bowl club, a math club, a spelling bee club, a drama club, a chess club and a safety patrol club. The school's after school academy, Wildcat Learning Village, provides extra help to struggling students each spring in preparation for GA Milestones.

College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI)

College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) is Georgia's statewide accountability system. The CCRPI assesses how well students are prepared for college and careers and ensures that schools are focused on improving achievement among all students. The index measures progress on indicators such as content mastery, student attendance, and preparation for the next school level. Schools earn CCRPI points based on indicators that vary by grade and school level and align with measures of college- and career-readiness. Schools may earn up to a set number of points in three main categories, for a total of 100 possible points.
