School and Community

Windsor Spring Elementary School, home of the “Hornets,” was built in 1964 to serve the south Augusta neighborhoods located between Peach Orchard Road and Tobacco Road. At that time Windsor Spring or as it affectionately became known as “the Spring,” was one of only two elementary schools located in South Augusta, with Gracewood Elementary being the other. The school name was selected because of our close proximity to the famous Windsor Spring, whose water was taken by President Taft on his trips to Panama and other countries. Our initial enrollment was almost 1200 students, many of whom were part of military families stationed at Fort Gordon. We are serving 3rd generations of students here at Windsor Spring.

General Information

College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI)

College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) is Georgia’s statewide accountability system. The CCRPI assesses how well students are prepared for college and careers and ensures that schools are focused on improving achievement among all students. The index measures progress on indicators such as content mastery, student attendance, and preparation for the next school level. Schools earn CCRPI points based on indicators that vary by grade and school level and align with measures of college- and career-readiness. Schools may earn up to a set number of points in three main categories, for a total of 100 possible points.
