

Our Goals for 2025–2026

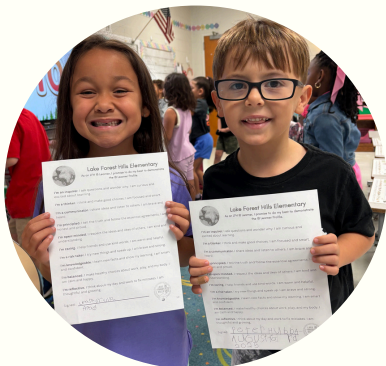
By June 2026, 100% of students will demonstrate academic growth in reading and math as measured by iReady with at least 85% meeting or exceeding typical growth goals.

Students in grades 3–5 will demonstrate proficiency or higher in ELA (51%), Math (50%), and Science (41%) on Spring EOG. Student perception survey results will show that at least 95% of students report feeling safe, respected, and supported at school, as measured by Panorama and student surveys.

100% of staff will participate in at least two professional learning opportunities focused on instructional improvement and leadership. At least 50% of students will engage in leadership opportunities.

Increase stakeholder involvement by increasing community partnerships by 25% as measured by PTO membership/ sponsorships, School Council, and volunteers.

Increase family participation by offering a variety ways to engage in our school community such as curriculum nights, student-led conferences, and feedback surveys.
