Chariots.....Sean O'Loughlin

Chariots is a work that reflects O'Loughlin's love for the classic film scores of Miklos Rozsa, Alex North, and Bernard Herrmann. These composers were known for such epic films as Ben Hur, Spartacus, and Citizen Kane. Chariots frames the sound of these scores.

All the Pretty Little Horses.....Anne McGinty

All the Pretty Little Horses (also known as Hush-a-bye) is a traditional lullaby from the United States. The origin of this song is not fully known. The song is commonly thought to be of African-American origin. The best-known versions of the song are written from the perspective of the mother or caretaker singing a baby to sleep. The singer is promising the child that when he or she awakes, the child "shall have all the pretty little horses.

On the Edge of Tomorrow......Michael Sweeney

Although not meant to depict any specific serires of events, the opening section of this work is suggestive of intense energy, colored with a touch of angst. The repetitive rhythmic patterns and angular harmonies are combined with fierce punctuations from the percussion section. A calmer and slower middle section presents a more reflective mood, with a glimmer of optimism and strong sense of faith in tomorrow. The original tempo returns, but with a renewed sense of hope that as we near "the edge of tomorrow" things will be better.

# Columbia.....Randall Standridge

A musical work inspired by the personification of liberty, "Lady Columbia," and the American frontier, featuring hints of the American West, Aaron Copland, patriotic melodies, and rustic barn dances. The piece begins with a fanfare echoing the Great Plains, transitions to a segment reflecting on forests and lakes, and concludes with a return to its rustic, driving, and rhythmic "Americana" style.

# An American Elegy......Frank Ticheli

An American Elegy is, above all, an expression of hope. It was composed in memory of those who lost their lives at Columbine High School on April 20, 1999, and to honor the survivors. It is offered as a tribute to their great strength and courage in the face of a terrible tragedy. I hope the work can also serve as one reminder of how fragile and precious life is and how intimately connected we all are as human beings.

# Devious Dance......Dakota Penderson

From the striking and somewhat sinister opening strains you'll know immediately that this is not just a normal dance! This energetic and rhythmic work features a driving pulse throughout, along with a sprinkling of dissonances and cluster chords to create a sense of tension and excitement. The dynamic percussion writing helps propel this creative piece from start to finish.
