- 2. Pledge of Allegiance
- Approval of Agenda All members approved agenda

- 6. Report of the Principal

Attendance- This is an issue across the board. 40% of the students at ARC missing 6 or more days from school which is hurting our CCRPI Score. Certified letters are being sent out if you miss 2 or 5 days from school in a row. We have an officer to go pick up any students that need to be in school.

- 7. Old Business
 - SPLOST- passed and ARC will receive 14million to tear down CTAE section of the school and rebuild with 18 new classes, better access between the old and new building and replace flooring.
 - Human Resource- We are currently at full staff. We will have 3 retiring, one teacher moving to Davidson, one teacher going to AR Johnson, and one teacher resigning to further her education. We will be adding a reading and math specialist to the staff.

- 8. New Business
 - Master Scheduling- Is almost done. Like putting a puzzle together.
 - Cyber Security Plans- 2 years ago we started the Intro Digital Technology class. We need more hands on lessons.

Questions: We found out Augusta University collaborating with ARC, by allowing ARC to use or have access to their Cyber System.

Ms. Bishop announced Ft. Gordon will be having Adopt a School Breakfast on May 5th from 7:30a.m. to 9:00a.m., for administrators. Units will be choosing schools to volunteer at, based on needs administrators provide.

We had a SAT Prep in December for 20 kids, it cost \$300 per kid, but was paid for by student vending profits.
