## Course Description:

This Spanish language course focuses on introducing communicative competence in the target language and understanding the culture (s) of the people who speak the language. Because students may begin formal language learning at various stages of their cognitive development, teachers must adjust vocabulary and content to reflect developmentally appropriate interests. An important component of language classes is the use of language beyond the classroom in the real world. The integration of technology is an important tool in accessing authentic information in the target language and in providing students with the opportunity to interact with native speakers. By the end of this language course, students will exhibit Novice-Mid level proficiency where they can express basic personal information and satisfy a limited number of personal needs using formulaic and rote utterances, lists, and phrases (ACTFL Proficiency Guidelines, 2024).

### Course Objective:

By the end of the Spanish course, students should be able to use their language skills (listening, speaking, reading, and writing) beyond the classroom setting and converse with native speakers at a basic level. He/she will also have learned about Spanish-speaking countries and briefly know those countries' cultures.

## Reassessment of Major Grades:
