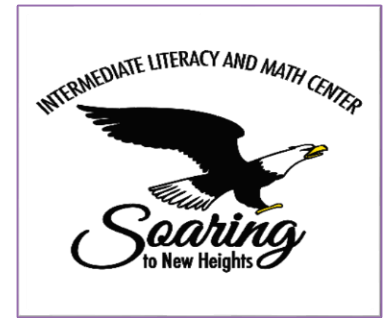
School Information
